

FY2020 Title III Questions on RFP Process and the Responses

Q - I am a little confused to the submission portion of the grant process.

A - The Final Format and Submission information is on page 4 E3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 of the application instructions.

Q - One original single sided hard copy of the application, budget and attachment (DO NOT STAPLE). Do you want this hand delivered?

A - The answer to this is on page 4 E5, 6 and 7

Q - Thirty (30) signed single sided hard copies of application and budget. Also, hand delivered?

A - The answer to this is on page 4 E5, 6 and 7

Q - We would like to apply for funding for our senior transportation program. Do transportation programs fall under Priority Area 2 – Long Term Supports and Services, specifically 2.3 Support and increase access to community based long term supports and services.

A - Yes

Q - The state requires all contractors, employees and volunteers undergo criminal background checks. Can you offer some cost-effective ways that other agencies conduct criminal background checks?

A - Agencies have not shared cost-effective processes

Q - What are the minimum and maximum grant award amounts?

A - There are no minimum or maximum grant award amounts.

Q - If we proposed to provide health services, what are the requirements for a health room?

A - Health rooms need to be in compliance with your local health department. Check with the health department in your area regarding the requirements. The properly credentialed staff must be used.

Q - What in-kind resources can be counted toward the required match?

Kind are goods or services from a third party that your agency does not pay for.

Q - What are the requirements for how we count the number of seniors to be served? Can we count/serve only seniors in the Windham Region or can we serve seniors from the whole Eastern Region?

A - Each unique person is one unduplicated person. The measurement of the service is in the Reference Material on this site.

Any person 60 years of age and over can receive service. See the application instructions on this site; page 3 #3. Ex: A resident of Sprague travels to Windham for a Title III service. This is a countable service.

Q - Can we submit more than one application if we are addressing more than one service category?
