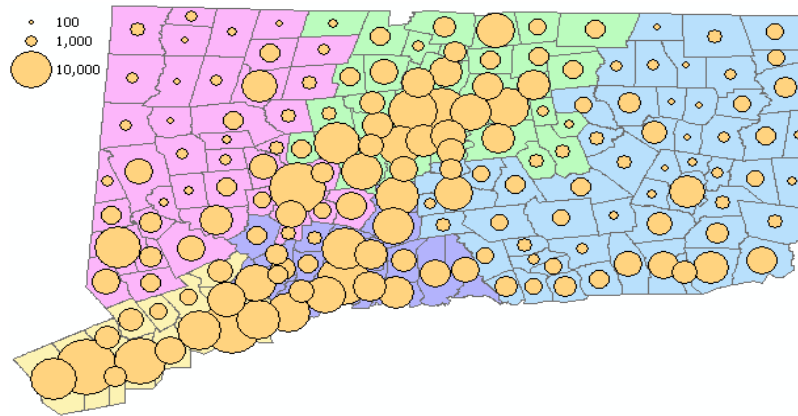

Distribution of persons age 60 and above by town and AAA region



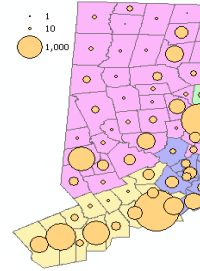

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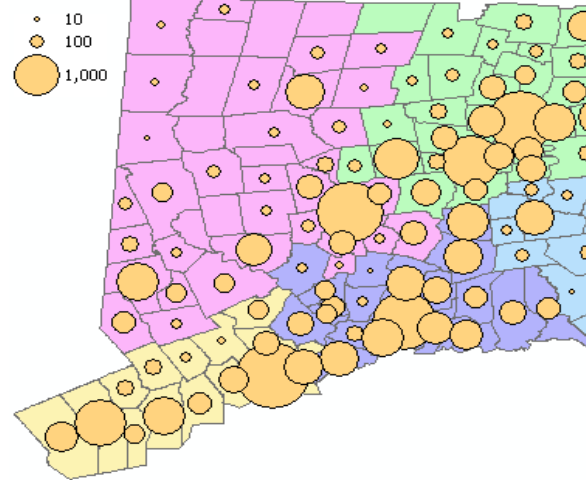

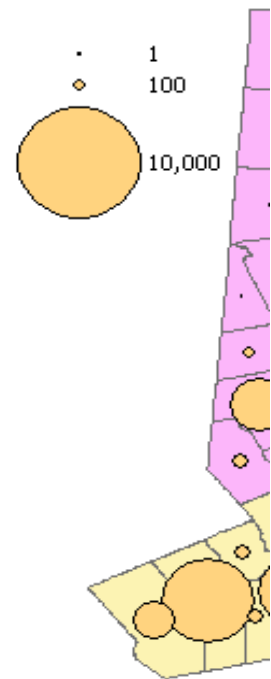

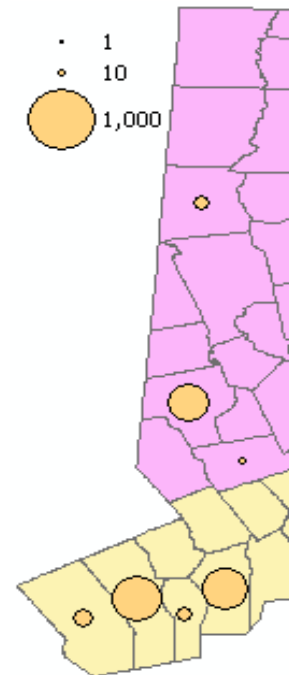

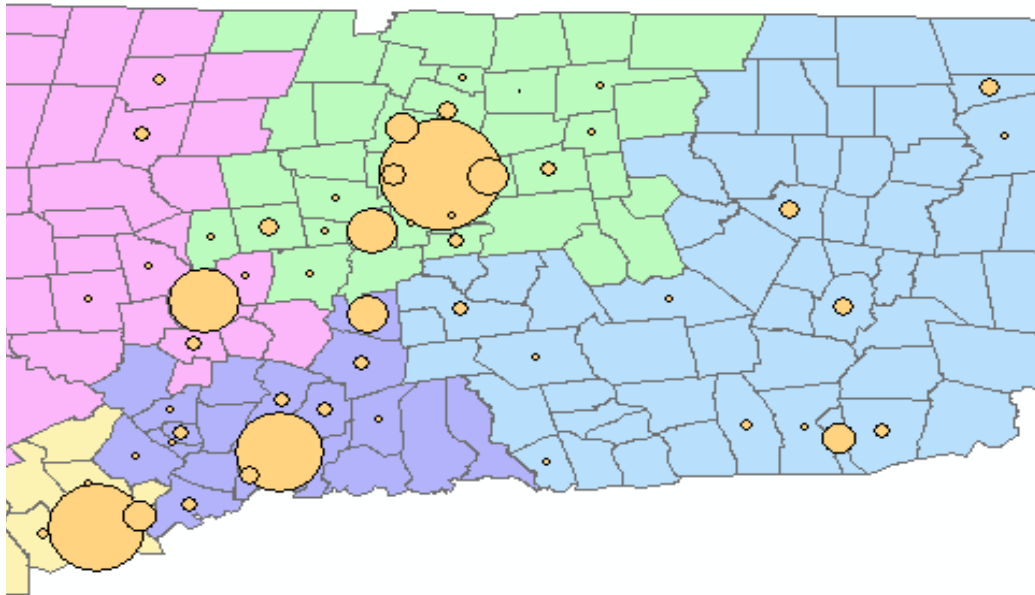

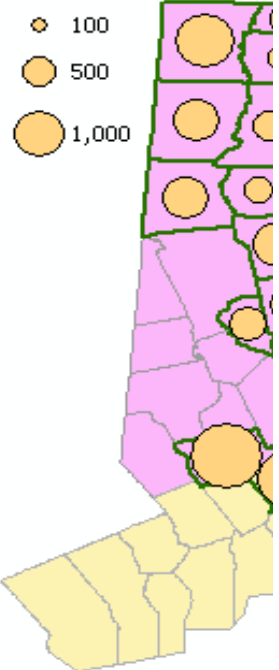

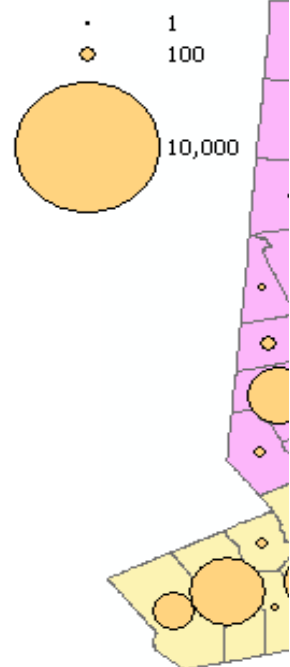

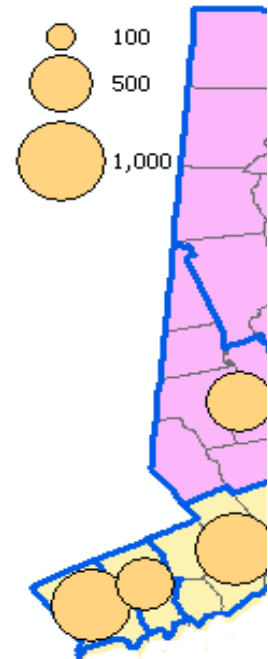

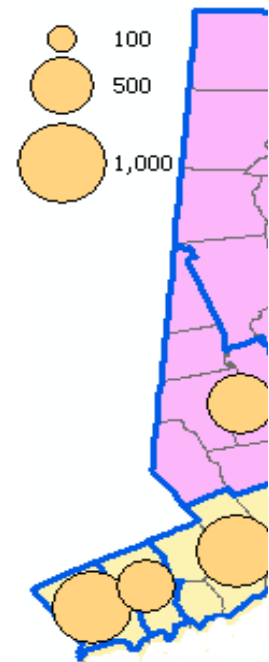

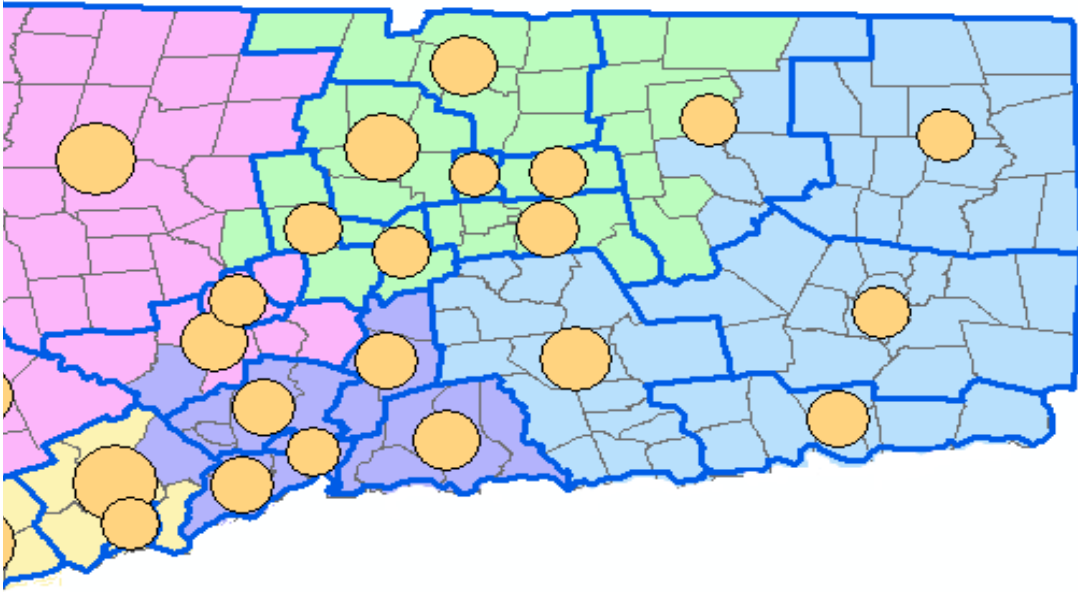

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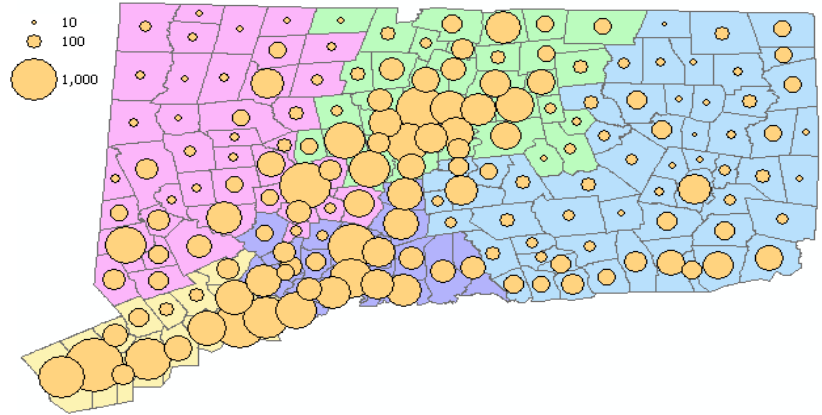

**Important Note:**

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The reader should be aware that the above estimates are very broad. They are primarily based on a set of prevalence rates for dementia by age and gender (see the first table, below, under "Assumptions") from the Aging, Demographics and Memory Study (ADAMS), which used a national sample to estimate predictors for the size of the total population with dementia.

Each rate in the table is the estimated percent of persons in each age group, by gender, who had dementia. The 95% confidence interval (CI) displays the reasonable range for each estimated rate. [Click here to read how to interpret confidence intervals.](#)

The reader should also be aware that the range of uncertainty increases when these estimated rates are applied to smaller populations, especially at the town level.

Since the sample for the ADAMS study was limited to persons age 71-and-above, the authors compared their estimates with results from other studies in order to estimate the number of persons with dementia between the ages of 60 and 70. The full set of rates was applied to each town's population by age and gender from Census 2010 to estimate the total number of persons with dementia.

Because the ADAMS study did not exclude nursing homes, the number of nursing home residents with dementia had to be subtracted from the overall totals. According to the quarterly CMS nursing home data for the second quarter of 2010, 49.95% of all Connecticut nursing home residents had a diagnosis of dementia. Without any data at the individual nursing home level, we had to assume that this rate was about even across the state. This rate was multiplied by each town's number of nursing home residents from Census 2010 to estimate the number of nursing home residents with dementia. That number was then subtracted from the town's overall estimate of the number of persons with dementia, to arrive at the estimated number of persons with dementia living in the community.

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**How to interpret a confidence interval**

The confidence interval describes the range within which a survey estimate is likely to fall if the survey were repeated over-and-over again.

For example, the ADAMS study found that the estimated rate for dementia among men between the ages of 71 and 79 was 5.25% with a 95% confidence interval of plus-or-minus 4.00%. This means that if the ADAMS study had been repeated over-and-over each time with a new random sample, then about 95 times out of 100, you would expect to see the new estimate fall within plus-or-minus 4.00% of the original 5.25% estimate.

Conversely, you should expect that for roughly 5 out of every 100 repeated surveys, the newly estimated rate would be above or below the original 5.25% rate by more than 4.00%.

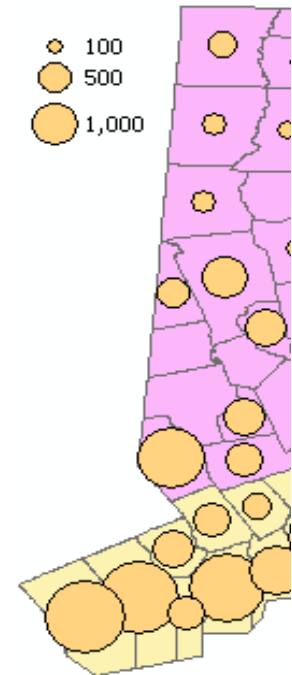
